 Accept: chocolate from the British troops to the Germans and sausages from the German troops to British.

Bravery took over because even though there was a chance that they would be attacked, the troops walked into No Man's Land to celebrate Christmas.

Accept any response which shows that the author's mood improved. E.g. In the morning, he felt despondent because it was the same as any other day. Then he felt anxious about attack. At the end he felt happy and relaxed due to exchanging gifts and playing football.



4. What do you predict the soldier wrote about next in his diary?

Accept a reasonable explanation, such as: playing football with the soldiers, enjoying the rest of the day playing games together, discussing and comparing gifts, returning back to their trenches at night time.
