



Home Learning: Class 4: Week Commencing 1st February

Class Video:

Every Monday, please find and watch the Class Video, explaining this week's tasks. Video links will be posted on the school website, on the Google Classroom Stream and in the Google Classroom Assignment Instructions.

English:

We will be streaming live lessons to support our learning in English. These will take place via Google Meet, on Tuesday - Friday at 9am. Look out for meeting invitations via email and in the Google Classroom Stream! The tasks to complete are detailed below:

Maths:

We will be using White Rose resources to support our learning in maths. For each session, there will be a video, and a worksheet to complete. Remember to pause and re-watch the video as many times as you need to so that you understand what you need to do.

If you are able to print the worksheet, use the 'write on' version - this has WO in the file name. If you are not able to print, use the display version (the file name has a D in it) to look at on the screen, then record your answers on a separate sheet.

Monday:

Find the 'Dialogue' resource. Use this to remind you how to punctuate direct speech. You need to 1 piece of dialogue today to use in your historical narrative about Anne Boleyn. Choose either to write a conversation between: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Anne Boleyn and a friendly visitor in the Tower of London OR <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Anne Boleyn pleading with a wicked guard. More information on this task is on this week's Class Video. Your dialogue should include each character speaking at least twice.

Science	
Go to the Oak National Academy Year 6 classroom here: https://classroom.thenational.academy/units/history-of-science-cfd6 This half term, we will be learning about the history of science. Our fifth session is called 'How has the discovery of DNA changed science?' There is a video to watch, and some activities for you to complete. Record your answers in a Google Doc, then 'turn in' with your completed homework tasks.	
This term our value is Perseverance. Write down three 'Words of Encouragement' (things you could say) to somebody else, to help them to keep going and to persevere when things get tough. These don't just have to be 1 word - they could be whole sentences. (You might also find it helpful to say these things to yourself when you are finding things tricky - I know I do!)	



Tuesday:

Find the 'Writing Dialogue' resource. Use this to remind you how to punctuate direct speech. You need to 1 piece of dialogue today to use in your historical narrative about Anne Boleyn. Choose to write a conversation between: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>The King's men questioning and accusing Anne Boleyn in the court room</i> OR <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>Anne pleading with the judge not to find her guilty</i> Your dialogue should include each character speaking at least twice. We will talk about this task further in our Live Lessons.

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Thursday:

English	✓
Find the 'Story Map' document. Use this to help you to create and illustrate your own story map for your Anne Boleyn historical narrative. You need to draw an illustration of the setting for each part of the story. You also need to show where you will include all the different pieces of your writing so far. You should have a character description, a setting description and two pieces of dialogue written already. E.g. write "Dialogue 1" in the "Sections I've written already" for "Tower of London: Anne's cell." Today, you also need to complete the 'Additional Words and Phrases' row. Add a sentence using PAST PERFECT tense to each part of your story. You can look at the 'Past Perfect Tense' doc to help you remember how to do this. Then, find your Rectangles Thing sheet. Add your Vocab and Examples from your Rectangles Thing to the place on your story map where you think that vocabulary might best fit. Your story map should now be crammed full of ideas and vocabulary which will help you to write your story. We will talk more about this task in our Live Lessons.	
Maths

RE	
Find the 'Was Jesus the Messiah?' document. This shows Chapter 1 and 2 of the book of Matthew from the New Testament in the Bible. Around the edge, in blue, are the things people expected from the Messiah. Make each of these blue 'clues' into a subheading. Now find and copy evidence for each blue subheading from Matthew Chapter 1 and 2 which led Christians to believe that Jesus was the Messiah.

Don't forget to add colour and finishing details to your portrait. Are there items in the background which you should include? Use whatever materials you have, and you think will work best to achieve a quality finished product. You may choose to shade with a pencil, to use paint, to collage, to use felt tips, or even to take a photo of your outline pencil sketch and use an app to add colour to it electronically (e.g. Scribble Lite). Your finished portrait should fill an A4 piece of paper.
