#### Mr Wiggans Forest School News....

Last week we learnt about apples. We are fortunate to have a range of different apple trees growing in the school grounds. So much to the delight of the pupils; we were able to collect a selection; and put them to the taste test. The pupils found it interesting discovering the difference they had between which apples they liked, which were sweet, which were sour. Juicy ones, tough skinned ones and the range of flavours irrelevant if an apple is red or green.



This week groups have been looking at common house and garden spiders. They were able to view a number of spiders in our two-way magnifier viewers. We have learnt about arachnids and intersecting facts about the spiders. Thankfully our spiders were quite small compared to the Goliath bird eating spider of South America that can grow to 30cm. Scary!

We learnt about the life cycle of the spider and how it catches its food. We explored the outdoor learning area and found many great examples of their webs.



This week, despite a few showers, we have managed to get out each day to the Outdoor Learning Area.

We have been looking at fires and how over time humans have made use of it to their advantage from heating, cooking, light and protection.

We have cooked Drop Scones with Cinnamon Sugar on the fire in a large pan and discussed different cooking methods on the fire.

Class 4 pupils also had a session on fire lighting with some great success.

#### **Class 3 Roman Baths Trip**

On Friday (29th), Class 3 were lucky enough to visit the Roman Baths in Bath. The children came into School at 7.45am in preparation for their 2-hour minibus journey and despite some very questionable singing; we made it to Bath on time and ready for the day ahead. We navigated our way through the busy City Centre and found our base for the day at the Education Centre. Our first activity was a self-led audio tour of the Roman Baths.

The children loved typing the numbers into their audio guides and finding out more information about the artefacts on display in front of them. We learned all about the different baths and what they were used for and we were even lucky enough to meet a 2000-year-old Gaul who told us some wonderfully dramatic stories.

After the tour, we returned to the education centre where we joined up with Beaford and High Bickington for lunch. Our afternoon started with a classroom session where we rotated around 3 Roman activities. The activities were mosaic-making, artefact handling and dressing up like Romans. The children showed an eagerness to be stuck in and especially loved dressing up Mrs North and myself in Togas.

To end the day, we went underground beneath the Roman Baths for an investigation activity. The children used archaeological skills to uncover artefacts hidden in the sand and grit. We also used iPads to find different rocks, which were used in the original building of the Roman Baths.

The children represented the School impeccably throughout the day and everyone got stuck right in to all of the activities throughout the day. Well done Class 3!


