

On Saturday (4th), we were lucky enough to take a group of KS2 children to watch Wales v Barbarians in an international Rugby fixture. Despite the damp conditions, the children were super excited and boarded the coach ahead of the journey over the bridge to the Principality Stadium in Cardiff. Our first job was to navigate our way through a crowd of 55,000 people to find our seats in the stadium! But when we finally arrived, the game certainly didn't disappoint. The game finished 49-26 with tries being scored left, right and centre! I was so impressed with how the children kept themselves safe in such unfamiliar surroundings and we are also incredibly grateful to the parent volunteers who helped make the trip possible.



On Monday (6th), we had our first football league fixture of the season away at Bishops Nympton Primary School. Last year, in this same fixture, we were on the receiving end of a 15-0 loss so the children were eager for some sporting revenge.

If anyone has any OLD wellies that they would be happy to donate for general use or as spares, please send them in as well.






