Mr Wiggans Forest School News....

This week, as a treat we have been learning about fire and cooking on it. The pupils learnt about the fire triangle of Oxygen, Heat and Fuel and how to break this Fire Triangle to distinguish fires.

We have made drop scones, also known as Scotch Pancakes. Mixing self-raising flour, caster sugar, baking powder, egg and milk. These were classically made on a solid metal griddle on an open fire. Now it is more practical to use a large non-stick frying pan. We served ours with a cinnamon sugar. Yummy!



Essebeare Farm School

This week a group of our Class 4 pupils visited Essebeare Farm to learn about crops. Farmer Olly took the group to his polytunnel where he discussed the different farming types and we then looked at the effect of the cold weather on some of his crops.

The pupils then picked the remaining cherry tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, aubergines and beans. The pupils learnt about "food miles" of certain produce stocked in the supermarkets in Britain.


