Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this newsletter finds you well. It feels like the weather has really turned this week, and we can feel a cold snap in the air. All children can bring in <u>named</u> hat, scarf and gloves to wear at break and lunch time.

This week, it has been anti-bullying week. We started the week by wearing odd socks to demonstrate that everyone is different and unique. In our classes, we completed activities linked to the theme for this year of 'Make a noise about bullying'. The children discussed the difference between bullying - which is ongoing, repeated incidents of unkind behaviour - and a falling out with a friend. We also linked this back to our new 'School Code' for this year.

On Tuesday, we learnt more about how to spot the symptoms of diabetes, as part of World Diabetes Day, which is a day to celebrate progress in diabetes care and an opportunity to raise awareness.



- \* Type 1 diabetes is a lifelong condition for which there is currently no cure.
- \* The exact causes of Type 1 diabetes are still unknown.
- \* It is often diagnosed in childhood, however you can develop Type 1 diabetes at any age.
- \* There is no food you cannot eat.

Management of Type 1 diabetes is complex and involves the use of insulin to help manage blood glucose levels. Living with Type 1 diabetes can feel relentless but with advancements in research, the way Type 1 diabetes is managed is ever improving.

Many people are not aware of the symptoms of Type 1 diabetes. Diabetes UK is a fantastic charity and their website has a wealth of information. There will also be some posters displayed on the school main entrance door over the next couple of weeks to help raise awareness. There are leaflets with further information available if needed which you can collect from the school office.





On Thursday, we had our termly review, which is an OFSTED style deep dive into the curriculum provision we offer here at Witheridge. I am pleased to inform you that the review went really well, and we were able to show off our fantastic writing, EYFS and PE provisions. Of course, there are always things we need to work on, but it is great to hear that we have made such wonderful progress since our grading of 'Good' in September 2021.



Today, we are celebrating Children in Need in our classes by wearing something spotty! The children look fantastic, and it is great that we have been able to raise a whopping £41.00 for the charity. Thank you for all your generous donations.



The children who participated in the Go Beyond residential have just arrived back in school - it is great to hear that they had such a wonderful time! Thank you to Josette and Hayley for accompanying them on their visit.

Next week, it is Assessment week for all children in Y2-Y6. The purpose of this is for Class Teacher's to make an informed decision about exactly where the children are in their learning and what they need to focus on next. This week we have been investigating Arachnids and in particular Spiders.

The pupils have had a chance to take a close look through our "viewers" to examine a range of house and garden spiders.

With over 30,000 species in the world there are plenty of types.

Despite the fear of some of the pupils, they were all quite brave and happy to get up close to them.



We discussed the life cycle of a spider and how the female spider cleverly creates an egg sac to protect its eggs. Spiders can lay between 2 to 250 eggs.
