Mr Wiggans Forest School News....

This week we have embarked on an exciting project or re doing our school's herb garden. Over the years, the herbs have either died or outgrown their pots.

Pupils from Class 1 and Class 3 have been busy tidying the area up, re planting and sowing new herb seeds that we hope will fill some of the gaps.

The students have learnt about how we use herbs in our cooking and have had the opportunity to smell and even taste some herbs.

Essebeare Farm School

This week some pupils from Class 2 visited Essebeare Farm accompanied by Mrs.Lewis and Mr.Wiggans.

We visited the river flowing through the bottom of Farmer Olly's land. The pupils looked at the riverbank and how it is being eroded by the river. As there had been quite a lot of rain, the river was up and brown in colour. Farmer Olly explained how the mud increases the nitrogen in the river and hence you get algae lower down the river that reduces the oxygen for the wildlife.







He talked about the 'Culm' region, a national character area, in North Devon.

We looked at one meadow that holds the water and provides a unique habitat for animals. It includes many grasses and common rush. We inspected the reed beds for frogspawn. We did find evidence of many water voles. They had nibbled the rush plants and left cut stalks and droppings.









We then visited Farmer Olly's Fen meadow watching for Woodcock and Snipe over from Russia. These are on the RSPB red list and are quite rare. We used an app to identify birdcalls on Olly's mobile phone and recorded Song Thrush, the Eurasian Wren and European Robin.

Down by the river we discovered new electronic equipment that measures the water level via a probe. This gathers data in a top box and via a computer with a mobile phone relays the information to a satellite. Info then goes to a scientist who works in Exeter to look at the effect of the changes in climate that have a knock on effect to the rivers and flooding possibilities.


