Some of the older pupils have learnt how to light a candle safely with a match and all pupils have looked at a range of ways that we can cook using a fire.




Pupils were able to sample the drop scones made on the fire or make their own twists using a type of dough.



Please note that all parents/carers must be responsible for their child while on school premises.












