
To help with our session, we really need LOTS of plastic milk bottles and plastic bottles. Any size is fine, and if they can have their lids, too, that would be great.



Mr Wiggans Forest School News....

This week we have been exploring the Outdoor Learning Area for signs of spring. The crocus's are up and also some beautiful daffodils. A clear sign that it is Spring.

The pupils have been learning about daffodils and we have dissected one to look at the parts of its head.

We have learned how daffodils were first cultivated by the Romans back in about 200-300BC. The daffodil was turned into disinfectant, hair dye or even a cure for warts and scars! They were sadly then forgotten about and reintroduced in England in the early 17th century.

The pupils learnt about the life cycle of the daffodil and made their own flower.

We also looked at the famous William Wordsworth Poem "I wandered lonely as a cloud" that is about the humble daffodil.

On Tuesday 5th March, our aspiring Exmoor Challenge participants from Witheridge and Pilton Bluecoat combined with Petroc College's Outdoor Adventure students for a day of navigation skills. An enthusiastic group of second year students tested their teaching skills on our eagerly anticipating children which was mutually beneficial for everyone involved. The children learned about grid references, mountain safety, compass bearings and pacing whilst working in small groups to replicate how the Exmoor Challenge is set up. A huge thank you to Mike Bazley, Jo Bazley and the students from Petroc Barnstaple for helping us out and we are looking forward to developing this working relationship in the future.



PE Forest School Event

On Wednesday 6th March, we hosted our second annual PE Forest School event at Umberleigh Academy. The day was designed to provide some of our children with an opportunity to collaborate and compete with other children across our Trust. Over 60 children from across our TEAM schools rotated around 3 activities throughout the morning. 
