Teeth brushing in The FSU

As part of our commitment to teaching and promoting the importance of good oral health, the children in our Foundation Stage Unit (FSU), take part in the Big Brush Club. This involves whole class teeth brushing during which the children are taught how to brush their teeth hygienically and effectively and instils this positive habit into their daily routine.

Our staff and children are doing a great job and, as we break for the Easter holidays, the children will be reminded to keep up their good work at home. We thank parents and carers for their support with this important aspect of their children's health and wellbeing.











Reception Class trip to RHS Rosemoor.

Last Friday Reception Class boarded the minibuses with great excitement; destination RHS Rosemoor. As part of our 'Let's Investigate' topic work, the children took part in a 'Who Lives in the Garden' workshop.

The children had the opportunity to see and handle some specimens of life found in the gardens, including an interesting feather, some badger fur, a deer skull and a dragonfly, during which the children impressed Rosemoor staff with some very knowledgeable responses. We learnt how to look for evidence of squirrels and mice by fir cone remains and to identify which animals had feasted on these by observing how they had been nibbled. We were then able to explore the woods searching for minibeasts in their habitat and the children each planted their own pea seeds. After enjoying our packed lunch, we explored the gardens, spotting a range of colourful spring flowers and treated ourselves to some fun in the playground before returning to school.

The children behaved brilliantly throughout and it was a proud moment for me to overhear the Rosemoor staff commenting on how Witheridge children know how to keep safe in an outdoor environment - it was clear that their Forest School and Farm School experiences have afforded them this understanding and I'm also pleased to report that their green fingers have ensured that their pea plants are currently thriving back in the classroom.

My sincere thanks to Mary Lucey and Rachel Stevens for accompanying us on the outing - we are very grateful to them for giving up their time to make the trip possible.

With this in mind, could we politely ask that NO products containing nuts be sent into school.



Farm School at Essebeare

Over the past few weeks, we have been visiting Essebeare Farm with Class 3 pupils to see what Farmer Olly has been up to.

We were fortunate enough to see Olly's pregnant ewes being sheared in preparation for lambing. It is called "Bellying" and the ewe's undercarriage is shaved making it cleaner for when the lambs are born. Because Olly's farm is organic, his ewes lamb naturally out in the field.

We then visited a site where Farmer Olly has put up an owl box in an old oak tree. The pupils learnt about the design of the owl box and facts about the Barn Owl. Olly has rigged a camera up near its entrance so hopefully we will be able to see some pictures if the box is used in the near future.

We then visited one of the orchards on the farm and helped Farmer Olly planting more rows of apple trees. The pupils really enjoyed this practical element of measuring, digging the holes and planting the young saplings. These apple trees had been provided by the Woodland Trust and were grafted "Mother" apple trees - a heritage variety.
