<ul> <li>The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles – we have been able to offer a greater variety of after school sports clubs, enabling more children to take part in regular physical activity.</li> <li>Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport – use of a dance teacher to come into school and work alongside KS2 class teacher to deliver dance unit.</li> <li>Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils – we have used the funding to offer a range of activities that we otherwise would not have been able to offer: rock climbing, archery, cycling, Taekwondo and cheerleading.</li> <li>Increased participation in competitive sport – all pupils have had the opportunity to compete against other pupils from across the South Molton Learning Community.
