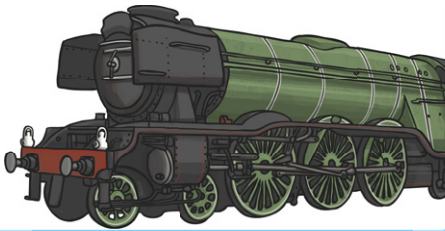


Semicolon Jigsaw
