Conjunctions

(to express time and cause)

after, before,
once, whenever,
because, since, as

Present Perfect

*I have walked to
my friend's house.*

Past Tense

*I walked to my
friend's house.*

Present Tense

I am *walking* to
my friend's house.

Inverted Commas

“Hello little kitten,” I whispered.

I asked, “Are you sleeping?”

Pronouns

I, you, they, we,
me, him, her, they

Adverbs

(tells us how, when or where something happens)

quickly, quietly,
fast, very, slowly,
straight, loudly

Fronted Adverbial

The day after tomorrow,
I'm visiting my uncle.

Excitedly, the kittens played.

Prepositions

(to express time)

tomorrow, on,
in, at, next, last

Possessive Apostrophes

- the kitten's toys (*singular, one kitten*)
- the kittens' toys (*plural, more than one kitten*)

Determiners

(words that come before a noun)

my, this, that,
a, the, every

Verbs

(doing or action word)

jog, draw, cook, sing,
laugh, work, play

Nouns

(name of a person, place or thing)

cat, pen, owl, ball,
jam, doll, shoe

Adjective

(describes a thing or place)

green, clever, long,
helpful, beautiful
